REFLECTION

This month's reflection is drawn from a document from Rome entitled: "The Pastoral Conversion of the Parish Community in the service of the evangelising mission of the Church".

 The Church is the community gathered around the Table of the Word and the Eucharist. The Parish is a portion of that community. It is the House from which the Word of God and the Sacraments are brough to a particular territory at a particular time.



In order for the journey of the Word to continue, the Christian community must make a determined missionary decision "capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channelled for the evangelisation of today's world rather than for her self-preservation.

- However, it is no longer the primary gathering place that it once was.
 Parishes must adapt both to greater use of technology and to greater mobility. This involves renewal with the evangelising mission as its guiding principle.
- The parish must evolve into a community of communities. We have to convert ourselves before we can be properly equipped to convert others.
- This can only be done by a sustained reflection on the Scriptures particularly the Acts of the Apostles [which we read at Mass in the Easter Season] and by an understanding that we are energised and led by the Holy Spirit.
